Palm Resaca Park had invested a lot of space and money in our shuffle courts. They are one of the first things

our residents and visitors notice when they come to Palm Resaca.

On Dec 9, Monday evening, 20 people played on 5 of our 10 courts. In a few weeks, those numbers are going

to swell to 30 or more as more people arrive at the park. I will have to ask them to attempt a game on cracked

courts in the dark or turn them away. The lights around the shuffle court are either burned out or insufficient

and the lack of proper drainage is causing the cracks in the courts to become worse.

I don't think Dave Jacobson's, the Rec club President's request in early November to Misty for a replacement

light on the northeast corner has been looked after promptly.

I am making a formal request to the BOD to ask that they have that bulb replaced with one sufficient for

our needs before the end of this month.

Playing Shuffle was not the priority when the lights were replaced in the past with insufficient bulbs. I'm sure

the new ones are a lot cheaper to operate and the money saved was the priority over our residents' activities

but they are not sufficient for our game.

Play in the day! Yes, I can understand how that would make things a whole lot easier as far as the lighting is

concerned but that leads to another problem. Our courts have no protection from the sun. Palm Resaca has

one of the few courts in a 55+ park that isn't an indoor facility. At this time we have shuffle 3 times a week at 10

am and by the end of those games, the players are half-cooked by the sun. It's impossible to stand on the

courts for a full game in the afternoons on most days so we can't schedule games then. I'm not asking for a new building.

I am requesting that our BOD consider providing some type of fixed, permanent shade over the ends of

the courts.

No one at PRP missed the fact that the rains last week caused our courts to be under 3 inches of water.

I am asking the BOD to have the drains on the court properly cleaned, not just the debris removed from

the covers but the pipes themselves routered so they work properly.

It is that soaking water on the courts that is making our cement cracks worse and resurfacing is going to be

required if the drainage isn't addressed properly.

With shade, drainage, and proper lighting, our shuffle courts could become a thriving activity in our park once again.

We have already invested a lot of money to build and maintain our courts, our residents enjoy playing the

game and now I am asking for some serious attention to the maintenance.

This will be table for now since we are making money. We made \$1,043 and have three items on Ebay. Next year the sale will be moved to January 30 & 31st. The committee is asking that no activities be scheduled the night before the scale - too crunched for time.

Christmas Dinner (Cheryl McCleod) - Will do it again next year. Cheryl has a list of items she would like purchased for the kitchen. The list will be forwarded to Linda R. Increase budget from \$2000 to \$2500.

Book Club (Sylvia Bauder & Deb Coleman) - The club is expanding - there are currently over 20 members. We will be hosting in doublewides next year to accommodate. Time changes from 10 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. so as not to conflict with Monday walks. The current budget to buy one selection for the library with a budget of \$75. There is a request to increase the budget to \$100. Since the numbers are growing, there is also a request to increase to \$200 and buy two books for the library.

Kitchen (Gayle Jacobson & Linda Rogalsky) - The park usually hires a deep cleaning of the kitchen after the last patio parties. Gayle will coordinate this with Misty.

Wine Tasting - (Dan Zimmerman & Elnora Colley) - We did not make money - lost \$257 because of "no shows". Also would have made money if they hadn't had Abby (music). The food trucks were a hit and they are interested in coming back again.
